If your organization has not reviewed or updated your bylaws recently this workshop will assist you with both the review and updating. 



Alberta Agricultural Society Century Award

The Lamont & District Agricultural Society



The Lamont & District Agricultural Society was chartered in 1918 by a group of likeminded farmers looking to better the community. In 1971, the Lamont recreation center, community hall and hockey rink were built, providing a much-needed service to the community, which was later sold to the Town of Lamont to operate and maintain. In 1987, the agricultural society hosted a Spring Bust Out Rodeo, the first indoor rodeo to be held in Lamont. They also hosted a summer fair that was an attraction for all ages.

In 1992, the rodeo joined the fair outdoors and was renamed the Summer Sizzler Rodeo as it is known today, having just celebrated its 25th anniversary this past summer. Two years later, the first indoor Bullarama Supreme was held and has become a community favorite ever since.

In 1998, two scholarship awards were developed to honor the families of past volunteers who contributed many hours to the society and has since helped almost 40 students attend post-secondary education. Over the years, the Lamont Agricultural Society participated in various community events with other organizations, including parades, pancake break-



fasts, and 4-H functions, and has donated \$500,000 to various community-minded projects.



In 2009, the rodeo grounds were renamed in the memory of Mr. Conrad Schinkinger, a lifetime member and volunteer who gave countless hours to the community. In 2012, the first Combine Crunch was held providing spectators with a different outlook on your traditional smash derby.

The year 2014 was filled with challenges as the lease with the Town of Lamont for the use of the arena and outdoor grounds was terminated and the agricultural society was at a standstill. The membership approved the purchase of 42 acres of land south of town to build a new facility. This was a large undertaking, as there were pole barns that needed to

be moved from town.

The year 2015 marked the first Summer Sizzler rodeo hosted on the new grounds and in 2016, the first outdoor Bullarama Supreme was hosted outdoors. Since then, there have been tremendous strides in developing the grounds to include the pole barns, concession, office, outdoor riding facility and a derby pit. The agricultural society is proud to have been a part of the community for the past 100 years and hopes that everyone will join them in celebration of this milestone this summer during the Summer Sizzler Rodeo.






