

Strategic pillar for AAAS Infrastructure renewal

- Alberta is receiving \$140.6 million for community, culture and recreation projects over the next 10 years (2018-28).
- \$150 million for the Community
 Facility Enhancement Program
 which provides non-profit
 organizations with funding for local
 public-use facility enhancements.
- \$352 million for sports and recreation projects and programs.
- Ag Society infrastructure program.







- Recognizes agricultural societies for their innovation, resilience, and commitment to their communities
- Applications are open until November 30th
- 3 categories
 - Smaller primary (less than 1,000 people)
 - Larger primary (1,000 or more people)
 - Regional

Agricultural Societies Infrastructure Revitalization Program (ASIRP)

- New capital grant program
- \$2.5 million per year (ongoing program)
- Supports major repairs at <u>existing</u> facilities
- Exclusive to agricultural societies that own or operate a facility

Program Outcomes

- Extending the useful life of the facility
- Addressing health or safety issues
- Improving functionality or service delivery
- Reducing operating costs



Funding

Total Eligible Project Costs	Matching Requirement (20%)	Grant Amount
\$12,500	\$2,500	\$10,000 (program minimum)
\$125,000	\$25,000	\$100,000 (program maximum)



Sample Projects

- Roof repair
- Commercial kitchens
- Washrooms
- Accessibility improvements
- Lighting
- Heating
- Insulation

- Refrigeration
- Ventilation
- Windows
- Doors
 - Etc.



Project Assessment

- First-come, first-served basis so long as all eligibility requirements are met
- Projects must be fully planned including costs, timelines, and outcomes
- Matching funding in place
- Supporting documents must be provided (quotes, donation letters, photos etc.)



How to apply

- Complete an application form
 - Agree to program terms and conditions
- Application deadline January 31, 2024
 - The grant budget may be fully allocated before the deadline



Project Management

- 18 months to complete project upon receipt of grant funding
- Applicants responsible for all local permits and approvals as required
- Spending and borrowing in accordance with your bylaws
- Final report will be required
