The Alberta Association of Agricultural Society (AAAS) is a not-for-profit, non-governmental, provincial association originally formed in 1905 and officially incorporated in 1947, that advocates and provides resources for the **291** Agricultural Societies in Alberta.

We are located in Edmonton in the Ministry of Agriculture building (J.G. O’Donoghue) thanks to our strong relationship with the Ministry and their support of the Provincial Association. AAAS is incorporated under the *Societies Act* (which is different legislation than the Agricultural Societies in AB are incorporated under). The Association is governed by a volunteer board made up of 10 Directors - 9 elected from 6 regions, and 1 elected service member director. The operations are managed by a Chief Executive Officer and management team.

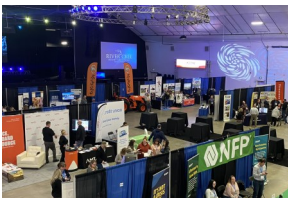

Annual Convention

AAAS hosts an Annual Convention every February. It offers an opportunity for Ag Societies across Alberta to gather, attend workshops and share ideas. The Convention also includes a 2 day tradeshow and nightly showcase entertainment for our Ag Societies to connect with service members and entertainers. Our Convention also holds an MLA & Minister forum, in which our members have a chance to speak with our Provincial leaders, ask questions and have their voices heard.



Tradeshow

The AAAS tradeshow is an opportunity for companies to share their products & services with AG Societies across Alberta. Tradeshow booths also provide opportunities for networking with other businesses, industry professionals, and potential customers. You can engage with visitors to your booth, exchange business cards, and potentially establish new relationships that can lead to future collaborations or partnerships.



Showcase

Showcasing your act at the AAAS Convention is an opportunity to help artists build a grassroots following by helping them get into towns and festivals within the local communities. Participation in the convention provides artists and/or entertainers exposure and booking opportunities to nearly 500 convention delegates representing more than 291 Agricultural Societies and the many events they hold throughout Alberta. Delegates attending the convention are board members, volunteers and community leaders who are key influencers and decision makers.



Alberta Open Farm Days

Alberta Open Farms Days is an incubator for agri-tourism and rural sustainability. We bring Albertans together through educational and experiential agricultural-based initiatives to learn about where their food comes from. As well, some of Alberta's most talented chefs and rural communities will be hosting a memorable series of farm to table culinary events that will be held around the province using Alberta farm products.

An Interactive Mixed Reality Safety Show. WHAT IS THAT ? A mixed reality is a blend of physical and digital worlds. We strive to bring farm safety into the 21st century utilizing state-of-the-art LED projection and interactive gaming. An artfully designed 3D farm comes to life and takes the audience on a journey through the dangers farmers face every day. This program highlights the negative impact every day injuries have on farms, reinforces the positive impact safety training has, and concludes the whole experience with accredited safety resources and training program-Ultimately bridging the gap and creating a seamless transition from awareness to action.

Treasurer’s Training Workshops

AAAS Treasurers Training: Levels 1,2,3. This course is intended for those interested in bookkeeping. Agricultural Society Board Members and staff including but not limited to Presidents/ Chairpersons, Treasurers, General Managers/Facility Managers, Secretaries, Bookkeepers, Office Administration. There are no prerequisites to begin this training.



AG SOCIETIES AT A GLANCE

Ag Societies work to enhance quality of life by developing programs and services, and providing facilities that meet the needs of their communities. There are currently over 700 facilities in Alberta, some of which include ice arenas, riding arenas, community halls, curling rinks, barns, and campgrounds that are owned and/or operated by Ag Societies in Alberta.

In addition, Ag Societies fill other community needs such as providing education in Agriculture, organizing and hosting sports, cultural and recreational events, as well as offering safety courses and seniors activities.

In support of education and youth, Ag Societies offer scholarships and partner with other community groups (including 4-H) in developing educational programs, and sending youth to leadership and educational camps.

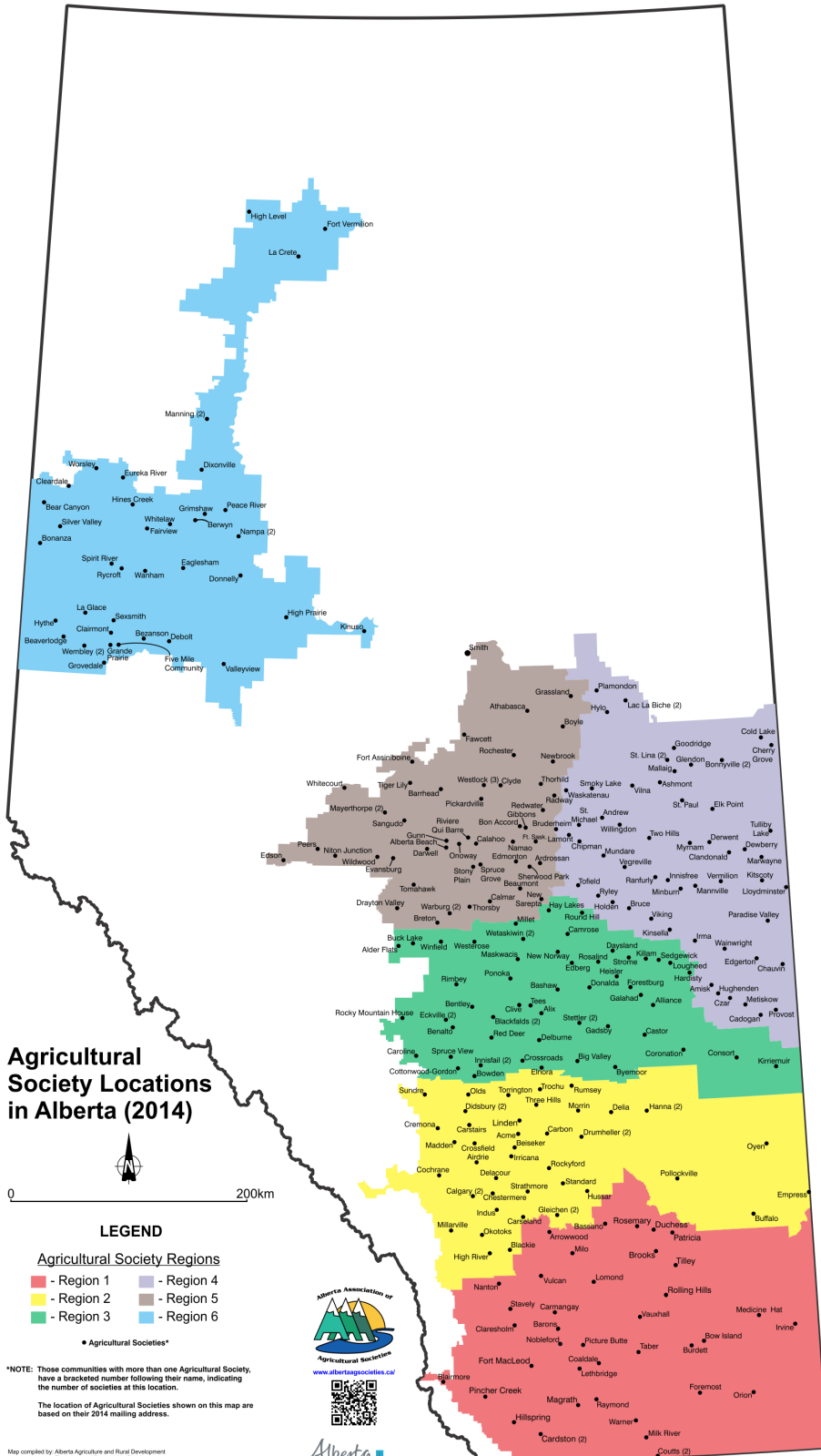
