MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Welcome to fall! It always seems summer goes by so fast. It is great to see the dust of harvest in the fields and the coming bounty from all the hard working farms across our province.

The end of summer also marks the end of summer fair season. To all the thousands of volunteers who invest so much into making their communities vibrant and connected THANK YOU! Although Mother Nature is not always on our side the people who show up, buy the tickets, enjoy the food and the entertainment sure are. Indications are attendance was great across the province and there were few disruptions. The fairs, rodeos, festivals, demo derby's, tractor pulls, dances and bench shows and so many more activities create, lasting memories for families and individuals. These activities build our communities and are at the heart of agricultural societies across Alberta, Canada and North America.

Earlier this year we had concerns over certain policies with in Alberta Gaming liquor and Cannabis (AGLC). Particularly the use of gaming proceeds. AAAS was able to provide feedback and support to the AGLC board on impacts of the policies and suggested positive changes. AGLC has made positive changes to these policies and we believe our members and all not for profits accessing gaming funds will benefit from. We will continue to monitor these important programs and provide input when needed.

As many are aware the Regional Agricultural Societies have had some success in gaining some much needed support from the Alberta Government. Much of this support is focussed on improving governance systems and infrastructure assessments. AAAS will continue to support our Regional Ag Societies were ever possible as they work through their individual pathways forward. It has also been indicated that there may be some focus being placed on the Primary Agricultural Societies in the near future. We are confident that the ground work laid out through the Regional Ag Societies review will translate into greater awareness of the vital impact of agricultural societies across the province and further supportive programs.

Alberta's Agricultural Society Infrastructure grant has once again been distributed to over 30 Ag Societies. This \$2.5 million dollar fund was fully subscribed in only a few minutes of opening the application submissions. We are aware that there were many of you who were very disappointed to have not received support for this year. Unfortunately, \$2.5 million does not go very far when there is over a billion dollars worth of infrastructure to be maintained. The department has been utilizing the best possible means to distribute these limited funds. Please reapply as those who have already received funds are not eligible to apply again. You will at some point be approved, as long as the program continues.

2025 marked the 13th year for Alberta's Open Farm Days. This year we had the largest participation from our agricultural societies. The theme this year was "Water, the life blood of every farm" allowed every host to provide some focus on where and how they managed their water systems and how water impacted their operations. This made for great information for the general public and created some amazing experiences. The Open Farm Days team has presented another exceptional campaign and Albertan swarmed across our rural landscapes in search of knowledge and adventure. We are excited for what 2026 has to offer and have already begun the planning. Your Ag Society should consider adding this event to your community.

The fall meetings are scheduled and the locations have been set. The information is available on our website. Attending these meeting has been described by others as impactful, informative and inspirational. We certainly encourage your Ag Society to attend a meeting wherever it is most convenient for you. This year we will be seeking your feedback on important topics like funding, volunteers and infrastructure. We will also be looking to you for important feedback on how we are doing. Don't miss out on this opportunity to have your voice heard.

We are extremely excited to be part of the "You Make the Difference" initiative. This incredible program lead by Ian Hill and fully sponsored by Fairs.com is intended to give every Agricultural society volunteer, staff member or board member tools and strategies to address the complex challenges of today and propel you and your organization into the future. Our annual Regional Meetings kick off this fall across Alberta. Open to all, no matter your region—everyone is welcome to join the conversation and connect.

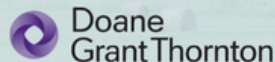

Funding fuels innovation at Big Marble Farms

Big Marble Farms—Alberta’s largest greenhouse—has secured a \$2.2 million grant from Emissions Reduction Alberta to install over 5,000 advanced grow lights. The upgrades will cut utility costs, reduce emissions, and boost yields by 45%. Minister RJ Sigurdson noted that Alberta’s farmers are leaders in growing more with less, and that this investment will help greenhouse operators cut energy costs, stay competitive, create jobs, and deliver fresh, local produce to families year-round.



Avian influenza detected in Alberta poultry flocks

The Office of the Chief Provincial Veterinarian (OCPV) reports four cases of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) have been confirmed to date in 2025. One case was in a small flock in May, and three cases (one commercial flock and two small flocks) were recently confirmed between September 8 and 10

Considering these recent detections, the possibility of a resurgence of domestic poultry cases in conjunction with the upcoming fall migration is a concern.

If you suspect your flock may have HPAI contact your flock veterinarian or the OCPV at 780-427-3448.

Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation also has an ongoing [Non-Quota, Non-Commercial Disease Investigation Poultry Program](#) to help small-flock poultry owners and their veterinarians (for flocks with symptoms that meet specific criteria).

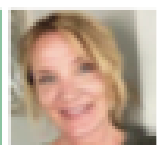

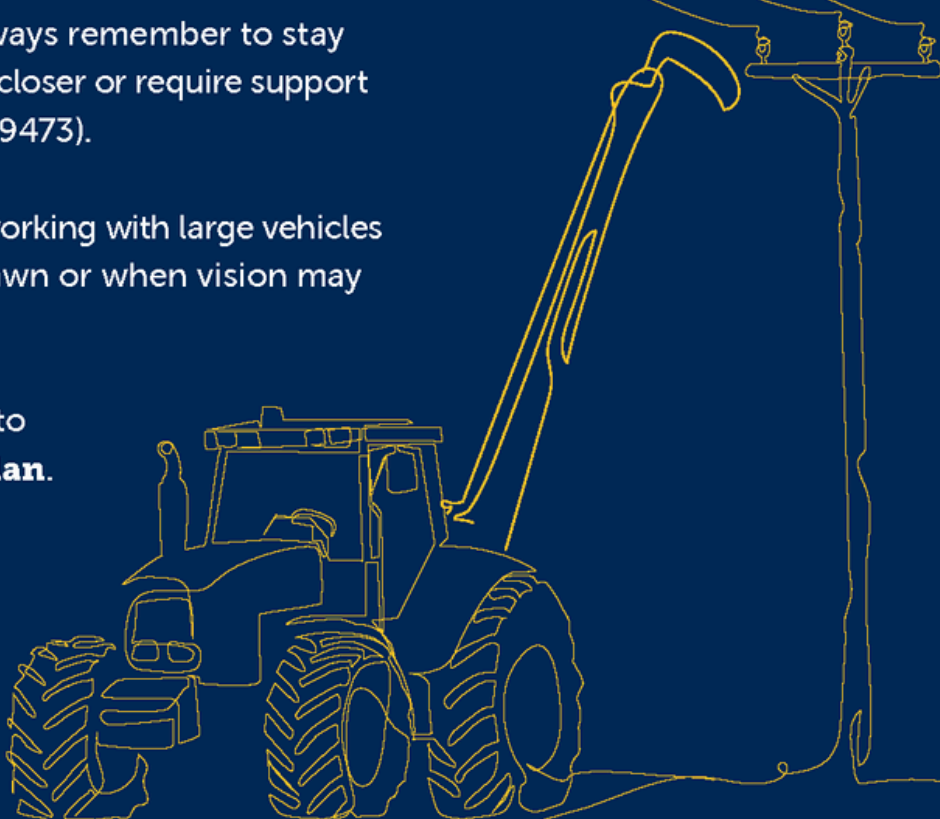

AAAS-OAAS CONVENTION EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Connecting Young Ag Leaders Across Provinces



AAAS and the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) have partnered to offer a unique convention exchange program for young professionals aged 18–40. Selected participants will have their meals, accommodations, and convention registration fully covered.

What is the Exchange?

The Young Professionals Exchange Program offers up to ten (10) young professionals involved with agricultural societies in Alberta the opportunity to attend Ontario's annual agricultural convention. This initiative is designed to foster learning, share best practices, build networks, and strengthen collaboration between agricultural communities in Alberta and Ontario.

2026 OAAS Convention Details

- When: February 19–21, 2026
- Where: Sheraton Parkway Hotel, Toronto North, Ontario
- What's Included:
 - Registration to the OAAS convention
 - Four nights' accommodation (shared with another delegate)
 - All convention meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner) on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday

Note: Transportation to the event and any meals outside the scheduled convention meals are not included. Selected participants are responsible for those costs. Alcohol not included. Transportation costs may be eligible under the leadership portion of the AAAS annual grant if covered by your home Ag Society.

Who Can Apply?

To be eligible, applicants must:

1. Be a member in good standing of an Alberta Agricultural Society.
2. Be actively involved in an agricultural society in Alberta (e.g. leadership role, committee work, events).
3. Be between 18 and 40 years old.
4. Be available for the full duration of the OAAS convention.
5. Commit to also attend the AAAS convention in the same year.
6. Applicants may participate in this exchange for up to two years.

This initiative gives emerging Ag leaders the chance to attend each other's annual conventions, share ideas, and bring fresh perspectives back to their home communities.

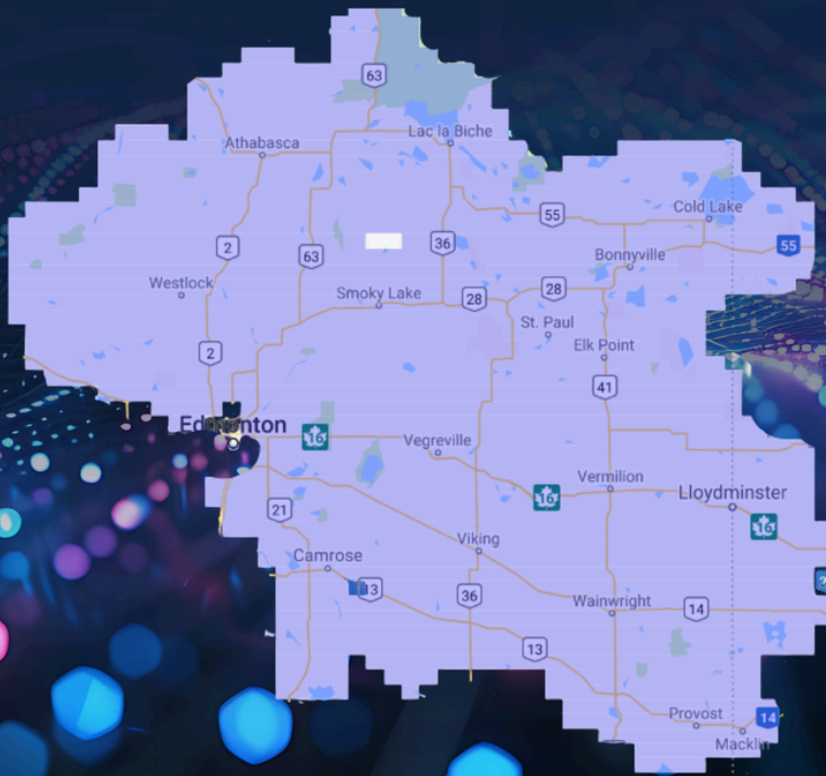

Crop Report Snapshot: July 2025

StatsCan just released the first look at this year's crop production, and here are some highlights:

- Canola is the winner → production is up 3.6% nationally thanks to stronger yields.
- Wheat is mixed → overall down slightly (-1.1%), with Alberta seeing gains while Saskatchewan and Manitoba slip.
- Soybeans are struggling → down 7.3% across the board.
- Corn holds steady → a slight bump (+1.4%).
- Barley & oats → barley dipped a bit, oats nudged higher.
-  Weather was uneven this season. Alberta crops look solid, Saskatchewan results depend on rainfall, and Manitoba faced one of the driest years on record.

***These are early model-based estimates. Final numbers arrive December 4, 2025.**

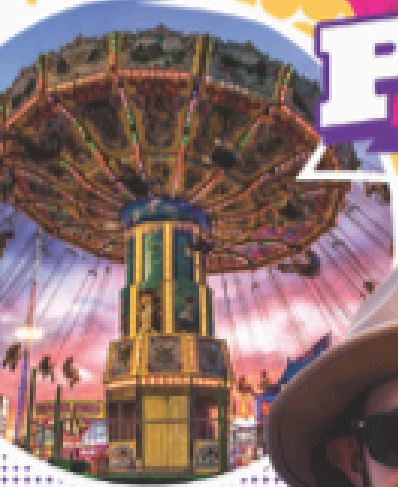
